Adverse Childhood Experiences



Adverse Childhood Experience (ACEs) are traumatic events such as child abuse/neglect or having a caregiver experiencing substance use, mental health issues, family violence, or incarceration challenges. Research has shown severe and chronic adversity can disrupt a child's neurodevelopment and increase the likelihood of negative health, behavioral, education, and economic outcomes.

The National Survey of Children's Health, administered by the federal Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), offers the most comprehensive data available on the prevalence of ACEs in Texas; however, because their survey is based on parent self-report and does not include questions about child abuse and neglect, even these numbers likely underestimate the actual incidence of ACEs.

Child Abuse/Neglect is not an indicator in this study. All surveys reported by a parent/guardian of only one child's experiences living in the home.

⁴Supportive neighborhood is defined by whether a) people help each other out within the neighborhood/community, b) people watch out for each other's children in the neighborhood/community, and c) the family knows where to go for help when they encounter difficulties in the neighborhood/community.
